In 1849, many people travelled to California to find gold and get rich. There were many groups with big wagons and in one of them was Louis Nusbaumer, a German man writing a journal of the trip. Up to the Rockies everything went well, but then there were rougher routes and the most groups only had a few wagons in Salt Lake City, where most groups gathered. In December 1849, they were in a desert and whished they were going with hunt. Nusbaumer changed the group and stayed a while at a friendly Indian family. Then, they came into Death Valley and it was a really hard time, because of the heat and the missed water. After the dead of an ox, they had to throw away belongings and a little later, they found a spring, stayed there and sent out two men searching for help. But the two men came back very late and Nusbaumer has left a short time ago. Now all groups travelled to Los Angeles, where Nusbaumer in March 1950 and the other groups a little later arrived. Then they travelled to San Francisco and reached their goal. Only four Forty-niners taking the short cut died and some of them even got rich.
